Enjoy this tasty recipe Fettuccine With Rainbow Chard and

White Beans Serves 4| Hands-On Time: 20m | Total Time: 20m

Ingredients
12 ounces

whole wheat fettuccine 2 teaspoons olive oil 2 cloves garlic, sliced

1 pint cherry tomatoes, quartered 2 bunches rainbow or red and green Swiss chard, stems and leaves separated and cut crosswise into 1-inch pieces

1 15.5 once can cannelloni beans, drained and rinsed

kosher salt

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes 1/4 cup grated parmesan cheese

Directions

Cook the pasta according to package directions.

Heat the oil in a large saucepan over medium heat. Add the garlic and cook, stirring, for 1 minute. Add the tomatoes and cook until they begin to break down and release their juices, about 2 mins. Stir in the chard stems and cook until softened, about 3 minutes. Add the chard leaves, cannellini beans, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and the red pepper and cook, stirring, until the chard leaves are tender, 3 to 5 minutes.

Divide the cooked pasta among individual bowls and top with the chard mixture and Parmesan.
